1. College Aspects:

1.a. Office Inauguration:

On Monday, 1st September 2025, College new office has been inaugurated by Mr. Tibrajyoti Das, President, GB, SSCE on the Occasion of "*College Foundation Day*". This set up is needed, due to severe damage of the old one by natural calamity.



1.b. Barsha Mangal –

This was observed on 8th August 2025 at our premises to welcome the monsoon season. Teachers and students symbolically represented the *five elements of nature – fire, water, wind (fan), soil, and space* – to emphasize ecological harmony. The Teacher-in-Charge, Dr. Trishna Goswami (Kundu), along with Dr. Sarmila Das, Asso. Prof. in Hist, planted a sapling to mark the advent of the rains. Students participated enthusiastically, reflecting environmental awareness and collective responsibility. The programme concluded on a meaningful note, celebrating nature, renewal, and sustainability.



1.c.1. Anti Ragging Week:

The Anti-Ragging Committee (ARC) at our college remains steadfast in its commitment to maintaining a safe, secure, and ragging-free environment for all students. A mandatory anti-ragging orientation session was conducted on 19th August 2025 for all students. The session covered the definition of ragging, its consequences, and reporting mechanisms. Posters and banners stating the anti-ragging policy, helpline numbers, and penalties were prominently displayed across the campus, including notice boards, canteens, and hostels. Information about the ARC, including contact details of all members, was uploaded on the college website and shared through official student groups.

Ms. Sharmistha Pramanik, Asst. Prof. in Zoology was selected unanimously as Secretary, Teachers' Council, SSCE and Smt. Anindita Bachhar, Asst. Prof. in Education was selected as Assistant Secretary, TC, SSCE. The meeting ends with a vote of thanks to and from the chair.

**2. Method wise Events and Activities:****Practicum Visit: Social Science****2.a. Education Method:**

As a part of Academic Curriculum (Field Visit, course 1.2.7A), Education Method of our college organised a field trip to reputed Educational Places namely, National Library of India and the Indian Museum, Kolkata with regular semester II (2024-2026), method students & method alumni on 6th September, 2025 under the direct supervision and coordination of both Dr. Trishna Goswami (Kundu), TIC, SSCE, and Anindita Bachhar, Asst. Professor in Education, offering a unique opportunity to explore the nation's educational, intellectual and rich cultural heritage. This trip also provided an opportunity of sightseeing, Police Museum in Alipore Jail Museum, Alipore Zoo aiming to strengthen the connection between theoretical knowledge and practical observation, thereby enriching the pedagogical skills of the participants.

2.b. Geography Method:

On 09th September 2025, the Geography Method students of our college conducted an Ecological Observation of a Botanical Garden (Acharya Jagadish Chandra Bose Indian Botanic Garden) Shibpur, Howrah as part of the fulfillment of the Course 1.2.7A practicum, under the guidance of Tirtha Pratim Mal, Assistant Prof. in Geography. The main purpose of this Ecological Observation was to observe plant diversity, ecological components, and the relationship between vegetation, soil, water, sunlight, and other environmental factors through direct field experience. During the visit, students identified different categories of plants such as trees, shrubs, herbs, climbers, and medicinal plants, and also noted the presence of insects, birds and animals which contribute to the ecosystem. This practical exposure helped the students connect theoretical ecological concepts with real-life observation and strengthened their fieldwork skills and environmental awareness.



2.c. History Method:

The History Method organised an educational field trip to Kalna on 18th September 2025 under the supervision of Dr. Sarmila Das, Associate Prof. in History. The trip aimed to provide students with firsthand exposure to historical monuments & enhance their practical understanding of history through direct observation. During the field trip, we visited several important historical places of Kalna such as Rajbari Complex (Pratapeshwar Temple), the 108 Shiva Temples (Nabakailas Temple Complex), Krishnachandra Temple, Lalji Temple, and the archaeological remains of the old royal palace. These places reflect the rich cultural, religious, and architectural heritage of Kalna and helped the trainee teachers to relate classroom learning with real historical evidence.

**3. Important Committees:****3.a. Bidhan Chandra Roy:**

Doctors' Day observation was observed on 1st

July 2025 by Cultural Committee in our College to honour the legacy of Dr. Bidhan Chandra Roy. The programme began with mantra chanting by Suchandra Ghatak Ganguly, followed by Mangal Lamp lighting and floral tribute by the professors. The welcome address was delivered by Dr. Trishna Goswami Kundu, Teacher-in-Charge, and reflections were shared by Dr. Sarmila Das, Asso. Prof. in Hist. A poem recited by Dr. Santanu Sen, SACT-I, a student speech by Prity Sarkar, and a chorus song by the professors enriched the event. The programme concluded with a vote of thanks by Anindita Bachhar, Asst. Prof. in Education and was smoothly anchored by our student Satyabrata Dey, making the celebration dignified and meaningful.

**3.b. Guru Purnima:**

Guru Purnima was celebrated with devotion on 10th July 2025, which began with an inaugural song by our student Mekhala Bhaduri, followed by the Mangal Lamp lighting ceremony. Teachers and non-teaching staff were felicitated by the Students' Council, and the welcome address was delivered by Dr. Trishna Goswami (Kundu), Teacher-in-Charge. Cultural performances, recitations, dances, a PPT presentation, and a tribute video enriched the programme, along with joyful participation of Professors in a student-organized game. **3.c. Educational Tour:**

The Educational Expedition to **Visakhapatnam**, organized by SSCE, unfolded from **28th July to 1st August 2025** with 49 trainee-students and 7 mentors, namely Dr. Sarmila Das, Asso. Prof. in History, Tirtha Pratim Mal, Asst. Prof. in Geography, Dr. Sambhu Nath Halder, Librarian, Lipika Saha, Asst. Prof. in Bengali, Jakir Hossain Mondal, Accountant, Prithis Kar, Library Peon, under the leadership of Dr. Trishna Goswami (Kundu), TIC, SSCE. The journey began aboard the Coromandel Express, leading to three days of immersive exploration.



Day One welcomed the group at RK Beach, followed by local market visits and cultural bonding over shared meals.

Day Two featured a scenic trip to Araku Valley, insights at the Coffee Garden, heritage at the Tribal Museum, and awe-inspiring wonders of the Borra Caves.

Day Three blended panoramic views at Kailash Giri Park, cinematic exposure at Rama Naidu Film City, seaside joy at Rishikonda Beach, and educational visits to the Submarine and Aircraft Museums, concluding with the bustling Fish Port.

The return voyage via Santragachi Station sealed the experience with camaraderie and reflection. This expedition transcended tourism, fostering cultural awareness, academic enrichment, and enduring bonds – an unforgettable chapter in the college's pursuit of holistic education.



3.d. Observation of Death Anniversary of Rabindranath Tagore:

"22 e Srabon" was observed on 8th August 2025 at our College to honor *Kabiguru Rabindranath Tagore*. The event began with an inaugural song and lamp lighting, followed by a welcome address by Dr. Trishna Goswami (Kundu), Teacher-in-Charge. A tree plantation ceremony and a commemorative session on Tagore conducted by Mrs. Camellia Yasmin and Smt. Tanima Roy highlighted the occasion. Cultural performances including RabindraNitya, Rabindra Sangeet and other reflections by both teachers & students.



3.e. Independence Day:

The 79th Independence Day was celebrated with patriotic fervour on 15th August 2025 at 8:30 a.m. onwards. 5. Curricular Aspects:

5.a. University Final Practicum Exam:

University External Examination of Practicum of Sem-I(Session 24-26) was held on tuesday, 19-08-2025 from 11am onwards. All the students of Semester-I(Session 2024-26) appeared in that examination. The External Examiner gave his words of appreciation for the outstanding performance of our students.



5.b. Test Exam:

Test Examination of Sem-IV (Session 23-25) was held on and from 06-09-25 to 08-09-25 from 12noon onwards in online and offline mode successfully. All the students of Semester-IV (Session 2023-25) appeared in that examination. The result of the said examination was published on 12th September, 2025.



5.c. External Exam for Evaluation of Practicum:

University External Evaluation of Practicum of Sem-IV(Session 23-25) was held on Saturday day, 20-09-2025 from 11am onwards. All the students of Semester-IV(Session 2023-25) appeared in that examination. The External Examiner appreciated the outstanding performance of our students.



5.d. School Internship:

From September 11, 2025, to September 23, 2025, students of semester-II (session 2024-26) participated in the school internship programme. This internship program included five local schools, and students attended the one they were assigned to learn about how the school functions. The schools are Bapuji Balika Vidyamandir(Girls), Simurali Upendra Vidyabhaban (High School), Simurali Upendra Vidyabhaban for Girls', Rautari High School (HS) and Kalyani University Experimental High School.



6. Innovative Practices:

6.a. College Foundation Day:

The Foundation Day of Shimurali Sachinandan College of Education was observed on **1st September 2025**, commemorating **55 years** of the institution. The programme began with flag hoisting by Mr. Tibrojoyti Das, and Dr. Trishna Goswami Kundu, followed by lighting of 55 diyas and cake cutting. An inaugural song and Vaidik Mantra set a solemn tone, and Mr. Tibrojoyti Das, Dr. Trishna Goswami Kundu, Dr. Sarmila Das, and Mr. Tirtha Pratim Mal were felicitated. 6.b. Orientation Program for WBSSC 2nd SLST (AT):

Our college successfully organized an Orientation Programme and Coaching in Online Mode for the candidates preparing for the WBSSC 2nd SLST 2025 from 25th to 30th August 2025.

6.b. 1. Bengali:

An online coaching for WBSLST 2nd Bengali subject 9-10 & 11-12 exams was conducted. 28 students have registered online for this. Assistant Professor in Bengali Lipika Saha and Dr. Parashar Gangopadhyay, SACT-II took classes online via Google Meet from 3-4 pm on 25-30 August. They discussed syllabus, question pattern, & student queries.



6.b. 2. Education:

An Orientation Programme about 50 (fifty) students for School Subject (XI-XII) 'Education' with the objective of preparing students for the post of Assistant Teacher(s) through WBSSC 2nd State Level Selection Test (SLST), 2025 was conducted under the academic leadership and coordination of both Dr. Trishna Goswami (Kundu), TIC, SSCE, and Anindita Bachhar, Asst. Professor in Education, through online session. Sessions highlighted the philosophical foundations of education, psychological principles of learning, child development, and motivation, curriculum construction, instructional strategies, evaluation techniques, ICT integration, Inclusive Education, educational administration, policies, and professional ethics for holistic development of students and the advancement of school education in West Bengal.

6.b. 3. Geography:

Orientation Programme for the Geography subject was conducted through online mode. The purpose of this orientation programme was to guide and support the SLST examinee in understanding the subject, syllabus, and overall academic expectations. During this period, an average of approximately 27 to 28 examinees attended the online sessions regularly. The examinee participated actively in the classes and showed interest in the discussions and learning activities. The online classes were conducted smoothly, and the programme maintained a supportive academic environment.

6.b. 4. History:

The programme was conducted, under the academic leadership of Dr. Sarmila Das, Asso. Prof. in History, who served as the Subject Coordinator, Introductory lectures on examination pattern, focused modules on key areas of History, including Ancient, Medieval, Modern, Historiography, etc was discussed in this online session. The programme enhanced the confidence and preparedness of aspiring candidates. Participants appreciated the structured guidance and the accessibility of online coaching, which ensured effective learning despite geographical constraints.

6.b. 5. Life Science:

An Orientation Programme and Coaching in Life Science was conducted, under the academic leadership of Sharmistha Pramanik, Asst. Prof. in Zoology, who served as the Subject Coordinator. Total Number of aspiring candidates registered for this program was twenty two. Introductory lectures on Examination pattern, focused modules on key areas of Life Science, including Botany, Zoology, Physiology etc. were discussed in this online session. The programme enhanced the confidence and preparedness of aspiring candidates. Participants appreciated the structured guidance and the accessibility of online coaching, which ensured effective learning despite geographical constraints.

**6.b. 6. Mathematics:**

An online orientation program and coaching session in Mathematics was successfully organized by the College. Under the academic direction of Camellia Yasmin, Assistant Professor in Mathematics and Tanima Roy, State-Aided College Teacher- II, who also served as the subject coordinators, the program ran from August 25 to August 30, 2025. It included focused modules on important areas of Mathematics, as well as orientation on examination patterns and format. Aspiring applicants' confidence and readiness were improved by the program. The organized instruction and online coaching's accessibility, which guaranteed successful learning in spite of regional limitations, were valued by the participants.

**6.c. Mathematics Achievement:**

Mathematics Achievement cum Diagnostics Test, 2025 was organized on 26.10.2025. Shimurali Sachinandan College of Education in Collaboration with Centre for Pedagogical Studies in Mathematics (CPSM) under the leadership of Dr. Trishna Goswami (Kundu), TIC, SSCE & the convenorship of Camellia Yasmin, Asst. Prof. in Mathematics. Participants in this test included 55 students from classes III to XI from nearly ten neighbourhood schools. To keep them motivated, candidates were given refreshment by the college. The event was concluded by an extension lecture session by Dr. Surapati Pramanik, an Asst. Prof. at Nandalal Ghosh B.T. College.

**6.d. Orientation Program of Sem-I (Session 25-27) :**

An orientation program was organized by our college for the first semester's students. From October 31, 2025, to November 3, 2025, students received orientation on various courses, and on November 4, 2025, they were briefed on several subcommittees.
